3 Demonstrate the project's relevance

Responses must not exceed 300 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.

3.3 Co-benefits

Describe the co-benefits the project will generate. If possible, include supporting figures.

For example: health, safety, quality of living environments, climate resilience and adaptation, access to housing, conservation of natural environments, economic development, and job creation.

Responses must not exceed 300 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.

3.4 Principles of equity, inclusion, and reconciliation

Where applicable, explain how the project incorporates principles of equity, inclusion, and reconciliation.

Responses must not exceed 300 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.

3.5 Project characteristics

Explain how the project is transformative, mobilizing, and innovative.

Guiding questions, without limiting your response: Is the project part of a long-term transformation vision? Does it introduce new practices, ideas, or methods in a community, offer an original adaptation, or scale an existing solution?

Responses must not exceed 400 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.

Indicate whether and how your project could be replicated and scaled across Greater Montreal, and how you plan to ensure the project's long-term sustainability.

For example: knowledge and expertise transfer, development of reusable tools, data, and materials, mobilization and partnership development, mechanisms for sharing and promoting results, etc.

Responses must not exceed 400 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.

3.7 Key members of the project team

Responses must not exceed 400 words. Any response exceeding this limit will not be considered.
